(Sarasota, FL-December 7, 2009) – Salt and Light Productions has won an Emmy Award for the promotional film it created for Micaiah Ministries.

On Saturday evening, December 5, The Suncoast Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences presented the prestigious award during its annual award dinner in Orlando, Florida. Emmy Awards have been presented by the Academy since 1949 to recognize excellence in television and advanced media programming.

The Micaiah Ministries video, which depicts the hands-on efforts of the United States based ministry to change the lives of street children in Saint Petersburg, Russia, earned the award in the category of Advanced Media Documentary.

The award is one of the highest honors that can be earned for television and advanced media programming.
